

## **ENGAGING COUNTRIES TOWARDS LOW CARBON AND RESILIENT BUILDINGS: STEPPING UP THE GLOBAL TRANSFORMATION AGENDA**

### Aim of the event

Following the EU Ministerial on affordable housing the previous day, this high-level event invites Ministers from the European, the MENA, and the Mediterranean regions. **The event will underline the need for countries to increase ambition and action for effective building decarbonization at home and to leverage strong international collaboration through channelling expertise and climate finance.**

It will emphasise countries' recognition of the critical importance of transforming our buildings for climate adaptation and mitigation, for citizen well-being, for decent work, and for a prosperous future for all. Importantly, it encourages countries to showcase what measures they are taking to step up ambition towards a truly low carbon and resilient built environment. It is an opportunity for countries to highlight the strategies taken and strategies underway, and it encourages countries to collaborate to raise each other's ambition level.
